

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

IDAHO VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL EDUCATION FOUNDATION, INCORPORATED

We the undersigned, incorporators, do hereby associate ourselves together to form and establish a non-profit corporation under the provisions of the corporation laws and other statutes of the State of Idaho and for that purpose state:

ARTICLE I

The name of this Corporation shall be; Idaho Vocational-Technical Education Foundation, Incorporated.

ARTICLE II

The period of duration of the Corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE III

The purpose for which this Corporation is formed, exclusively, is for vocational-technical educational purposes and the Corporation has no stated capital.

ARTICLE IV

This Corporation is created and shall be administered and operated for the purpose of promoting vocational-technical education in Idaho. It is not the purpose of this Foundation to supplement State and federal funds appropriated for vocational education. As an amplification of said purposes and without in any way limiting the same, it is contemplated that the further purposes of this Corporation shall be:

1. To solicit, request, receive and administer funds from private business, industries, organizations, associations, individuals, and federal, state, and local governments.
2. To support specialized training programs for new and/or expanding business and industry and/or Vocational Education personnel.

3. To purchase specialized kinds of instructional tools and equipment for use in local vocational programs.
5. To fund research which will support and promote vocational-technical education programs and activities which are directed toward the advancement of vocational-technical education.
6. To assist the states efforts in economic development and job creation as related to skill training.
7. To receive instructional equipment donations and disseminate such to local programs with the advice of the State Division of Vocational Education.
8. To establish a scholarship for an outstanding vocational-technical education student(s).
9. To establish a revolving loan fund for needy vocational students.
10. To hold title to real, personal, and intangible property and to take all steps permitted by Idaho statutes to manage and control such properties.
11. To enter into contractual arrangement with any other person, partnership, corporation, or educational institution for services deemed essential to properly effectuate the purposes of the Corporation.

#### ARTICLE V

The Corporation shall not have authority to issue capital stock.

#### ARTICLE VI

The location of the principal place of business of the Corporation in this State is the State Board for Vocational Education, 650 West State Street, Boise, Idaho 83720.

#### ARTICLE VII

The initial address of the registered office of the Corporation in this State is the State Board for Vocational Education, 650 West State Street, Boise, Idaho, in the county of Ada.

#### ARTICLE VIII

The name and address of its registered agent in this State is:  
Larry G. Selland, 650 West State Street, State Division of Vocational  
Education, Boise, Idaho 83720. In the event employment of the  
aforementioned individual is terminated, his successor shall be the  
registered agent.

#### ARTICLE IX

The State Administrator of Vocational Education, a member of the  
State Board for Vocational Education, the State Advisory Council  
Representative, and one person elected annually by the Idaho Vocational  
Association shall be ex-officio members of the Corporation with full  
voting rights and other privileges and responsibilities associated with  
membership.

## ARTICLE XI

The governing body of this Corporation shall be the Board of Directors. The number of members of the Board of Directors shall be not less than five (5) nor more than fifteen (15), and the manner of their selection shall be determined and provided for in the bylaws of the Corporation. The power to adopt, alter, amend, or repeal the bylaws or to adopt new bylaws shall be vested in the Board of Directors of the Corporation.

## ARTICLE XII

No part of the earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article IV hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a Corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

## ARTICLE XIII

Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation exclusively for the purposes of the Corporation in such


manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any of such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the District Court in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

#### ARTICLE XIV

The Corporation reserves the right to amend, alter, change or repeal any provisions contained in these Articles of Incorporation in the manner now or hereafter prescribed by statute and all rights conferred upon the members of the Corporation herein are granted subject to this reservation. These Articles of Incorporation may be amended only by consent of the members at a meeting called for such purpose.
